### **Clinical Training Program**

After a few years in practice many clinicians realize that additional training in psychotherapy enhances the quality of their work and personally sustains them. The Clinical Training Program (CTP) in Analytical Psychotherapy offered by the C. G. Jung Institute of Chicago, is a two-year program where clinicians meet once a month for a collegial weekend training experience. The program, which runs from October to June of each year, includes 144 hours of instruction and 64 hours of small group case consultation—all provided by Jungian psychoanalysts. Clinicians will learn the symbolic perspective within the context of a highly personal interactional field. They will learn to work with dreams, fantasies, the body, imaginal art, sandtray, and the interpersonal field of psychotherapy. Both the length and structure of the CTP enable an engaging, educational community for clinicians that encourages deeply personal learning as well as professional networking.

### **Admissions Requirements**

The CTP is open to mental health professionals in the fields of psychiatry, psychology, social work, counseling, pastoral counseling, and psychiatric nursing. All applicants must be licensed to practice psychotherapy in the state in which they practice, or must be under supervision within an organization. All participants must be covered by malpractice insurance. Applications are currently being accepted for October 2008. The application deadline is June 1, 2008. All applicants will be interviewed regarding their suitability for the program.

### **Curriculum**

**Instructional class** size is limited to 24 persons. Some topics covered in the instructional period are:

- 1) Ego, Shadow, Persona
- 2) Anima/Animus
- 3) Typology
- 4) Archetypal patterns

- 5) Active Imagination & Dream Work
- 6) Individuation and the Self
- 7) Alchemy & the Interpersonal Field

For group case consultations, participants are divided into groups of no more than eight. Each group is led by the same Jungian psychoanalyst for the year. In these seminars, which meet for four hours each weekend, participants will be able to apply instructional materials to clinical practice, personal experience, and the small group process. Members are expected to bring their own clinical work to the group for consultation.

### **Schedule**

The program is held the first weekend of the month from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday, beginning in October and ending in June of each year.

Each day's schedule is:

9:00-11:00 Class

11:15-1:30 Class

1:30-3:00 Lunch

3:00-5:00 Group Case Consultation

Participants are expected to have computer access and an e-mail address.

### **Tuition and Fees**

Tuition for the program is \$2700\* per year. At approximately 36 hours per quarter, this calculates to approximately \$25 per class hour. Payments are made the first month of each quarter at \$900 per quarter. A \$50\* non-refundable fee must accompany the application materials.

### **Continuing Education Credit**

The C. G.
